We would like to use this time to reflect on the wonder of God's creation, and the place of humanity within it.

To do this we have created three soundscapes inspired by a passage from Job. Each soundscape is split into two parts;


the first being sounds from 'pure' nature, the second having human influence, there's a short silence in the middle of each soundscape to mark the change.

While you listen, consider our relationship with nature. What can we learn? How can we grow together in harmony?

The structure of the service will be four sessions. Three readings, each accompanied by a two-part soundscape.

After which, weather permitting we will go outside for a fourth reading, time to listen to the outside live, with a closing discussion and prayer.
